Social Construction: Premises and Practices – Working within the Global Context

Every year, when I facilitate the online workshop on <u>"Social Construction: Premises and Practices"</u> I am reminded of our vibrant community, the rich resources we have within the Taos Institute and all the many connections and colleagues around the globe.

Last Spring we finished our 7th cohort for this online course that introduces participants to *Social Construction – Theory and Practice*. After every course is completed, the participants find their own ways to continue with their conversations, especially those doing their PhD research. They also organize themselves to attend together other Taos workshops, conferences and meetings so that they might expand the conversation.

Our <u>Taos Online Community Space</u> – a Ning website - is also a great place for such rich encounters to occur and I would like to call your the attention to the unique opportunities offered through this platform. There are more than one thousand members and ten different groups hosting different topics. We are a global community and technology can help us get connected and continue to co-create something beautiful.

I gain a lot from this "magical" community. Being surrounded by people working with projects all over the world feeds not just my professional life with insights to innovate in class and in my projects but also my multicultural being. I'm constantly being shaped and reshaped by these encounters. The immersion within the different cultures helps me to understand my own values in specific contexts, which in turn increases my cultural knowledge and awareness about others. The Taos Institute community constantly reminds me of the diversity of this world and the possibilities out there.
