- Prior to the conversation, we invite you to reflect upon and bring with you approximately half a page of your own or other's work that inspire you and illustrate evocative ways of writing. During the workshop, we will jointly explore these excerpts and dialogue about various ways to engage in writing as a relational practice.
- Date: **Bilingual** - September 6 at 12:00 noon to 1:30 pm New York Time/ US Eastern time
- The interest in exploring more evocative ways of storying organizational life is growing within the field of social science. During this conversation, we will jointly explore how we through words can loosen the reins of the often restrictive scientific ways of writing and instead embrace a way of writing where the multiplicity of relational co-construction emerges between reader and text. Gergen (2014) argues: "It is time for social sciences to channel their substantial resources of intelligence and ingenuity into creating more viable ways of living together." (p.: 21) Writing and storying organizational life is indeed a way to support the becoming of viable ways of living together. Each text embodies a future-forming invitation to jointly generate more viable, reflexive, responsive and ethical ways of living together. Furthermore, each text is a living story that in evocative ways allow for new plots and ways to move forward incrementally emerge as people read it and relate it to their everyday life. The plot of a story is not something we, as storytellers, can order or arrange, it will emerge as the reader engages in dialogue with the stories we share (Helin, 2015). Based on Gergen's (2007) book chapter, Jenny and Mette will present various ways of engaging in evocative writing as well as introduce practices that we rely on in our writing. We will also invite you to share your experiences with writing as a relational practice and to engage in a joint development of future-forming ways of engaging in evocative writing.
